Sen. Shapiro's Bill SB 1475 features	TCEQ Agreed Order
<p>1. Requires comprehensive health risk assessment of facility's air contaminant emissions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Study negative public health effects of emitted contaminants</li> <li>• Study increased cancer risk</li> <li>• Results must be submitted to City of Frisco and TCEQ</li> </ul>	<b>No</b>
<p>2. Allows state-collected funds to be used for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Assessment of environmental impact of lead-acid battery recycling activities</li> <li>• Creation of innovative programs for battery recycling process</li> <li>• Studies effects of lead-acid battery recycling on public health</li> </ul>	<b>No</b>
<p>3. Requires comprehensive health risk assessment of facility's solid waste units:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Study public health effects of contaminated soil, groundwater, and surface water</li> <li>• Study increased risk of cancer presented by contaminated soil, groundwater, and surface water</li> <li>• Results be submitted to City of Frisco and TCEQ</li> </ul>	<b>No</b>
<p>4. Mandates facility to cease operations immediately if health risk assessments reveal lifetime increase in noncancerous health effects or an increased risk of cancer.</p>	<b>No</b>
<p>5. Requires specific emissions controls for all material handling and processing areas.</p>	<b>No</b>
<p>6. Requires semiannual performance test of emissions controls proving 95% reduction in cancer-causing particulates and vapors. Results must be submitted to City of Frisco and TCEQ.</p>	<b>No</b>
<p>7. Provides facility 30 days to correct emissions that are not 95% effective.</p>	<b>No</b>
<p>8. Mandates installation of continuously operating air monitors:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to detect metals and volatile organic compounds at facility boundaries.</li> <li>• for opacity and emissions from stacks and vents</li> </ul>	<b>No</b>
<p>9. Mandates monitored emissions levels be posted in real time to publicly accessible website.</p>	<b>No</b>
<p>10. Mandates caps on closed or inactive solid waste management units.</p>	<b>No</b>
<p>11. Mandates negative pressure and enhanced filtration systems on active solid waste management units.</p>	<b>No</b>
<p>12. TCEQ to revoke a state-issued permit for two or more violations within 36 months.</p>	<b>No</b>
<p>13. Allows City of Frisco to revoke municipal permit for two or more violations within 36 month</p>	<b>No</b>
